**Strategies for Using Sandtray in Counseling with Children**

Many children treat sandtray like play therapy... Children rarely create a static scene Be ready for the scene to change, become alive, shift gears, and move beyond the physical tray Be mindful of not leading the child in this way by tracking too much...he may change his scene to please you (don't over-track what the child is doing)
