Only about 4,500 skilled male workers from the work commands, which were held in "the small ghetto", and about 500 women, who had been classified as seamstresses, survived the Rumbula massacres. The first transport with 1,053 of Berlin Jews reached the Šķīrotava Railway Station in Riga on November 30, 1941.
