The law of Scotland is not a pure Common Law system, but a mixed system. Historically, partly the Scottish law stood originally even more in the tradition and under the influence of the Roman-juridical stamped continental law, and only since the 19th century the influence of the law "South of the Border" has strongly asserted itself.

By the twelfth century, the feudal system was introduced into Scotland. It was a decentralized social and economic system of government and land tenure. This system eventually developed into the parliamentum or court of law, and led to the establishment of the Curia Regis or great council, based on the English model.
