In Texas, the most common mulberries include the Red Mulberry (*Morus rubra*) which is usually found in deeper soil, and the Texas Mulberry (*Morus microphylla*), commonly found in the western half of the state. Both have edible fruit that ripens to a dark, purplish-black color and resembles long, thin blackberries.
